CO 2 local teams, 1 QM

Considering our level of preparation and the level of competition we faced, I was pleased with our results at Q2010. It takes a special kind of student to undergo that many hours of competitive jumping and answering over a period of four consecutive days. In between, our students re-connected with a number of others they had met at previous events, and made many new acquaintances. A lot of times I am asked why this is called "internationals" when most of the competition, including the Regional A and B teams, comes from the eight USA regions corresponding to the Nazarene universities in this country. Actually, there were two quiz teams from outside the U.S: one from Ontario, Canada and the other from Antigua in the Caribbean. Our Colorado students and the Antigua group got on particularly well.

For the record, the Springs First Church local team finished 6th of 45 teams in their division, the CO District All Stars finished in the middle of their division, and a mixed team of one Washington Pacific and two Colorado quizzers finished a bit below the middle in their division. Northwest Region "A" (two of five were from CO) came in 6th of 8 in the top level of competition. Cassie Langjahr, the young lady who has led the way this season both in Colorado and for the NW Region, was 8th of 40 in Regional "A" and 7th of 203 students in the local teams rounds. #3 The assignment that I was given last spring:

Regional Quizzing Advisory Council: (District directors or your designee)

One of my tasks this year was to come up with an age appropriate guideline for quizzing. Quizzers are eligible to quiz if they are 18 before the quiz year begins. They are able to start at age 11/12 if their youth group has 6th graders in the local NYI program. Those who turn 19 before January 1st who are still in high school would be allowed to compete. *Note that any quizzer who is a sixth grader and qualifies for the tournament at Regional ME is not eligible for on-campus housing.*

Also, regarding RME (TO BE CHANGED IN RME HANDBOOK):

1. There will be a limit of one all-star team per district at the RME quiz.
2. There will be a limit of one championship team from each district can be sent from that district, regardless of which denomination they are from, as long as they have participated in the district's quiz program that year.
3. The open division would include any team. (No limit of how many you want to bring.) These teams or quizzers would not compete to go on to nationals or for scholarships. {A \$25/team fee would be assessed.}
4. Only pre-registered NYC participants will be allowed to participate on the two regional teams at NYC in Louisville, KY in the summer 2011.

We were notified in June 2010 that Third Wave 2011 had been rescheduled to:

**January 3-8, 2012
Bangkok, Thailand**

Third Wave is a global leadership conference for emerging adults, ages 19 to 29, who display Christ-centered leadership potential and servant lifestyles.

Members of the USA Northwest Regional Council will select four participants from our region: <http://www.nwregionny.com/council.html>

Step1: Invite emerging leaders from your district. Ask them to pray for Jesus' direction. This is not for everyone or to be entered into lightly. Encourage them to consult mentors. Listen to Christ's spirit. Be open.

Step2: Complete the [application forms](#) and process. The total cost of the event will be determined at a later date**. Expect travel costs of close to \$2000. Creating a fundraising strategy needs to be a high priority if you are sensing Christ's call toward this journey.

Step3: Submit applications postmarked or electronically by May 16, 2011. Late or incomplete applications will not be prioritized. (We currently have two).

Step4: Interview times will be scheduled between May 16 and June 30 by phone or online (Skype/iChat). Third Wave Coordinator, RP, and Applicant's DP interview, evaluate, and decided on applicants.

Selected candidates will be notified by June 30, 2011.
